Vine St., Redlands, Ca 92373, Telephone: 793-8822 is a non-profit agency that provides: referrals for parent education, community service opportunities for youth, enrollment assistance for Medi-Cal or Healthy Families Insurance, and partnership/case management services at the Healthy Start Family Resource Centers located at Franklin, Lugonia, Mentone and Victoria Elementary Schools. All sites may access these services.

Colton At Risk Teens (C.A.R.T.) Academy, 650 North La Cadena Drive, Colton, Ca 92324, Telephone: 909-370-5000. CART Academy is designed to introduce youth to discipline, guidance, and career development through a free para-military program for students between the ages of 13-17.

Colton Redlands Yucaipa Regional Occupational Program (CRY-ROP) 1214 Indiana Ct., Redlands, Ca 92374. Telephone: 909-793-3115 offers vocational training for high school students age 16-18 at no cost and to adults for a small fee.

Gang Reduction Intervention Team or **G.R.I.T.** is a **youth violence prevention** program. Juvenile Intervention Program is sponsored by the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department Public Affairs Division. This program is geared toward those who have begun a negative lifestyle or are on the verge of heading down the wrong path, toward use of alcohol and drugs and participation in gang activity or violent acts. To qualify to participate, the student must be between 13-17 years of age, have not been to Juvenile Hall or involved in any ongoing criminal proceedings, the student must have a parent or legal guardian who is capable and willing to attend. The **Redlands Family Clinic** (a division of Redlands Community Hospital) located at 802 W. Colton Ave. Suite E, Redlands, Ca 92374 operates Monday- Friday from 8:00 a.m. -4:30 p.m. and provides medical services for those who are uninsured. The telephone number is 335-5799.

They provide low cost behavioral health and drug and anger management counseling. Vista also has school-based counselors at the District's elementary campuses for qualifying students who have Medi-Cal.

The **Youth Justice Center** is located at the Day Reporting Center, 1494 E. Art Townsend Drive, San Bernardino, Ca 92408- It provides specialized programming and instruction by Probation Officers to address topics such as **Anger Management, Victim Awareness, Drug & Alcohol Education, Shoplifting, Gang Involvement, and Truancy**.
